"I love the tangibility of it, the creativity," Powers said. "Every job you have, the layers are different. We're able to take a raw piece of land and visualize what it'll be, and then we make that happen."

A Woodlands resident since 1999, Powers does more than just build homes. He also gives back to the community he loves in a number of different ways.

"I try to stay active in the community," Powers said.
"I've seen The Woodlands really grow up as a Houston native, to now seeing it as an extension of Houston. I just love it out here."

Powers is also involved in a cause that stretches far beyond The Woodlands, however. He is currently helping raise funds to build an orphanage house in the troubled African nation of Zambia, a cause he became involved with through a friend who grew up in that country.

"Zambia has the highest per capita number of orphans in the world," Powers said. "They're just devastated by the HIV and AIDS epidemic. Half of them are under 16, and half of them are orphans. We're building a house over there this summer."

Powers is working in conjunction with a company called Family Legacy to bring the orphanage to fruition, and several families in the area will be making the trip to Africa next summer to help with its construction.

"We all get caught up in our day-to-day lives, but you see something like that and how you can have a direct impact on 12 kids' lives," Powers said. "It's pretty amazing. It has nothing to do with home building, but on a personal note, it's very, very important to me."
